

## The Story

Felix and Naomi Masenge, a Tanzanian Christian couple, had saved hard to buy land and build a house for their retirement. But as they started to build, they saw the devastating effects of AIDS on their community. More and more children were becoming orphans, making it impossible for them to have a basic education. Other children were denied schooling because their parents could not afford the fees. The Masenges, moved by the increasing helplessness of their own people, converted their dream home into a school.

Now Tuishime Nursery and Primary School in Arusha (close to Mount Kilimanjaro) provides high-quality education for 220 children aged 3 to 12 with plans to expand to 270. A significant number are orphans whose parents have died of AIDS. Demand for places is growing and the school still occupies what was meant to be the Masenges' home! Martin and Philippa Grosvenor from the UK met the Masenges while on holiday in Tanzania and were captivated by their inspiring story. They raised funds to build additional classrooms and buy two minibuses to transport the children to and from the local villages.

Tanzania is one of the poorest countries in the world with 60% of the population living on less than \$1 per day. The wealth gap between the average person and their equivalent in Europe is huge and increases each year.



## The Vision

Martin and Philippa set up Hope for Tanzania in 2008 to work in close partnership with Tanzanian people to:

- Develop Tuishime School by helping it become financially self-sufficient, funding further training for its teachers and expanding the school buildings.
- Improve resources in the School, such as books, sports equipment and ultimately introduce computers so that children receive an

education which is at a comparable level with that in Europe.

- Support projects, identified and managed by Tanzanians of high integrity, which will improve educational standards or generate long-term income and bring about lasting change.
- Assist selected Tanzanian individuals to become influential leaders by supporting their education, providing advice and encouraging them to live out Christian values.
- Challenge individuals, schools and organisations in the UK to give their time and skills to projects in Tanzania on a short-term or longer-term basis.
